A *cohort* will include teams from 2-4 schools or programs in a common community that serve children ages birth through 8 years and their families, totaling no more than 15 individual professionals per cohort.

Each *team* represents a single school or program, and will include 1 administrator, 1 support professional such as a counselor, special ed teacher, nurse, etc. (if available), and 2-3 teachers/caregivers. In this way, a small team of 3-5 people will participate from each school or program in a cohort.

Teams may come from any program serving the LAUNCH target population (birth-8); primary schools, early childhood and Head Start programs, or family-based child care.
