That same year she debuted the first annual Brown Mama Monologues showcase to an audience of over 200 moms. To date, The Brown Mama Monologues is hosted in two cities: Pittsburgh & the DC Metro region with the hopes of becoming a multi-city showcase. To add to the list Muffy was nominated for an Iris Award in 2018 for the outstanding work she's done as a writer, influencer and content creator on BrownMamas.com. 
