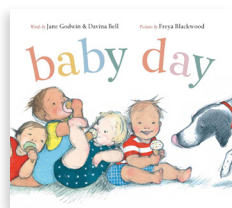


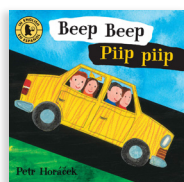

Simple words and lively pictures tell the story of a first birthday celebration.



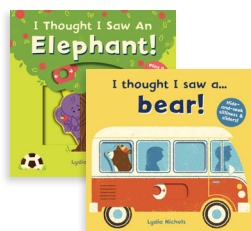

Black-and-white photos show babies who are smiling, yawning, eating, and waving in these board books.



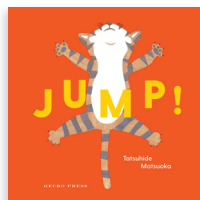
Beep Beep / Piip Piip (Candlewick Press)

Shaped pages, bright colors, and childlike pictures make this sturdy board book about a visit to grandma's house fun.



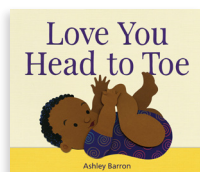
I Love All of Me (Cartwheel Books)

Bouncy rhymes describe all of the ways that babies appreciate themselves, from “wiggle toes” to “smelly nose.”



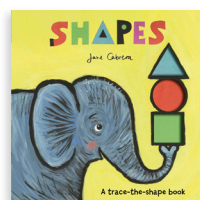
I Thought I Saw a Bear!;
