Establish Care and Education Needs:

 Begin to think about the child's needs in regards to education and overall development. It is appropriate for caregivers to identify goals they would like them to meet based on their current development.

 Educate yourself on safe practices being conducted at child care facilities. Ask lots of questions about health and safety practices and be sure to closely review each provider's family handbook for more information.

- Inquire about providers curriculum and assessment tools! You need to stay looped in about what lessons your child will be learning so you can practice at home too.
- Search for that "family feel" when you walk into a facility.
 Does the space feel inviting? Is the classroom warm and welcoming? Can you see your child being comfortable in this space?
- Inquire about communication policies. Communication and engagement are very important when caregivers partner with their child care provider in ensuring the best possible care and education for their child. In addition, seek ways that you can become involved in your child's early learning journey with their provider.
