- Maintain a project timeline and monitor and track progress toward goals.
- Develop strong relationships with all project partners.
- Serve as the primary point of contact for project partners, ensuring they
 have the information needed about progress, and that all deliverables
 are completed on time, on budget and exceed expectations.
- Continually seek strategic opportunities to build on project work and increase project impact.
- Have the ability to think critically when problem solving and decision making.

- Have excellent written and verbal communication, interpersonal and negotiation skills.
- Prepare and present progress and budget reports to the Associate Executive Director and Executive Director.
