An overview of Pennsylvania's investments in early care and education

One of the core elements of Trying Together's policy agenda is advocacy for significant investments to increase access and quality.

In Pennsylvania, there are state and federal funds to support early care and education. The Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL) is a dual deputate of the Department of Human Services (DHS) and the Department of Education (PDE) responsible for implementing ECE programs.

The following charts highlight state budget growth in four program areas. As a principal partner in the Early Learning PA (ELPA) coalition, Trying Together advocates for increased state investments in child care, home visiting, pre-k, and early intervention.

Child Care

The Child Care Services line item provides subsidized child care for low income working families. A portion of the funds are set aside to support Keystone STARS quality improvements for child care programs.

The Child Care Assistance line item provides child care to families receiving TANF.

The 2025–26 budget established a new \$25 million recurring line item for the Child Care Recruitment and Retention Program, which provides direct payments to eligible child care teachers to help stabilize the workforce and reduce classroom waitlists.

* \$25M specifically to serve families currently enrolled in Child Care Works up to 300% of poverty or the state median income (whichever is lower).

The General Assembly allocated \$90 million in federal funding to provide one-time child care staff recruitment and retention bonuses in FY 22–23.

** While child care received an increase of nearly \$104 million, this state funding was used to maintain the Child Care Works subsidy base rate as one-time federal funding lapses and in order to keep up with inflation.

*** Additional federal funds allocated to increase Child Care Works Subsidy rate to federally recommended reimbursement, which is not reflected in this line item.

Evidence-based Home Visiting

Evidence-based home visiting in Pennsylvania is funded across two line items. There are eight evidence-based home visiting models in Pennsylvania. While Nurse Family Partnership funds go exclusively to that model, the Community Based Family Centers line is for all evidence-based models to apply for in order to expand home visiting services.

Pre-Kindergarten

Pennsylvania’s state pre-k program Pre-K Counts is for families earning under 300% of FPL. School districts, STAR 3 and 4 child care programs, Head Start programs, and private academic nursery schools can offer Pre-K Counts programs.

Head Start Supplemental is additional state funding that federal Head Start grantees may apply for in order to serve more children and/or increase the length of their program’s day.

Early Intervention

Early intervention (EI) provides services to children from birth to five years who have developmental delays or a high probability of having a developmental delay. EI, Part C serves children from birth through age two and is funded through the Department of Human Services. EI, Part B serves children from three through age five and is funded through the Department of Education.

Our role: Launched in 2022 through the Thriving PA, Trying Together is a principal partner in the Early Intervention, Part C advocacy campaign.
